PACIFIC BREEZE CLEANING TIPS

Cleaning with Lemons



The acid in lemon juice removes dirt and rust stains. It's especially effective when mixed with salt, which in turn makes for "an excellent scouring paste".

Countertops: Dip the cut side of a lemon half in baking soda to tackle countertops; wipe with a wet sponge and dry. Don't use on delicate stone, like marble, or stainless steel (it may discolor).

Cutting Boards: To remove tough food stains from light wood and plastic cutting boards, slice a lemon in half, squeeze onto the soiled surface, rub, and let it sit for 20 minutes before rinsing.

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GARDENING: COMPOSTING



Leaves, leaves and more leaves! Composting is a fantastic way for dealing with them; it's low cost, doesn't smell or attract animals and it remarkably improves your soil. Just remember to cover it with a tarp to prevent too much moisture. The most important time to fertilize your lawn is in the fall, this helps your lawn develop a strong root system. Do this after a couple rains when it starts turning green again, or if your lawn has been watered regularly all summer... proceed at will. Now the lawn is ready to grow again, and will flourish with the nutrients it needs to recover from summer damage.

Cooking: CHOCOLATE LAVA CAKE



Ingredients:

- 5 oz – Semi Sweet Chocolate
- 2.5 oz – Bitter Sweet Chocolate
- 3/4 Cup – Unsalted Butter
- 4 Each – Eggs Yolks
- 3 Each – Eggs Whole
- 3/4 Cup – Sugar
- 3/4 Cup – All Purpose Flour

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 475.
2. Butter 8 – six oz ramekins, and dust lightly with flour. (not the “All Purpose Flour” listed above)
3. In a double boiler, melt the chocolate and butter together. Mix them. Once melted, let it cool.
4. Turn the mixer on medium speed, add the eggs, yolks, and sugar blend until it gets light yellow, fluffy and thick.
5. Add the flour to the mixer a little at a time, and mix for 3 minutes.
6. Add the cooled chocolate mixture, and incorporate by scraping the sides. (mix for 2 minutes)
7. Put 5 – 6 oz of the cake mix into each ramekin, and refrigerate for 1 hour.
8. After 1 hour in the refrigerator, place all 8 ramekins on a sheet pan and bake for 11-13 minutes.
9. Once the cakes get Puffy, shake them lightly and if they move like “Jello” they need more time, if they don't move, take out and serve with vanilla ice cream.
