PACIFIC BREEZE CLEANING TIPS

Cleaning with Toothpaste

Chrome fixtures: To polish faucets and taps in the kitchen or bathroom, smear a dime-size amount of toothpaste onto them, then buff with a soft cloth until they shine.



Scuffed linoleum: Reduce marks by scrubbing them with toothpaste and a dry cloth until no toothpaste residue remains.

Tarnished silverware: Put a dab of toothpaste on a soft cloth, rub it onto the tarnish, then rinse with water and dry with a clean cloth.

Steam iron: Mineral deposits can stain an iron's soleplate. Apply a dab of toothpaste and work it into the plate. Use a clean cloth to remove residue.

Piano keys: Rub each key carefully with a damp cotton swab and a dollop of toothpaste. Wipe dry and buff with a clean cloth.

GARDENING: Fall is coming

With fall approaching, here are the "to-dos" for your garden. You can start by pulling weeds in your garden. By doing this, it eliminates the opportunity for the weeds to release millions of seeds into the sailing winds. Remove flowers and seasonal vegetables and add them to your composting pile. Avoid adding diseased plants. Spread mulch throughout your yard. This protects your plants' roots by adding a layer of "skin". The "skin" endures frost and thawing while your plant doesn't. It also smothers all weeds and unwanted plants from growing. Clean off all your tools and store them in a controlled area. Do not leave tools outside because they may be exposed to freezing temperatures. Ideally store them in a place that is consistently the same temperature. Lastly, drain irrigation lines and drain all the gas from your lawn mower. Gas goes bad, and you will need to refill your engine after the winter season.

Cooking: Chicken Phad Thai



Ingredients:

- 4 Tbsp. - Vinegar
- 2 Tbsp. - Sugar
- 2 Tbsp. - Paprika
- 1 Tbsp. - Fish Sauce
- 1/4 Cup - Chicken Stock
- 2 Tbsp. - Soy Sauce
- 2 Tbsp. - Ketchup
- 4 Tbsp. - Vegetable Oil
- 1 Pkg of Rice Stick Noodles (soaked in water)
- 2 Chicken Breasts Sliced thin
- 5 Green Onions sliced thin
- 2 Carrots (julienne cut)
- 1/4 Head of Purple Cabbage

- (julienne cut)
- 1 Small Pkg of Bean Sprouts
- 2 Eggs (lightly beaten)
- 1 Garlic Clove Minced

Instructions:

1. Combine first 7 Ingredients and let sit.
2. Add oil to hot wok, then add garlic. Stir fry until fragrant. Add chicken to the wok and cook. After the chicken is cooked take it out of the wok and stir fry eggs.
3. Once eggs are cooked, add the green onions, noodles and sauce. Stir fry until hot.
4. Soak the Rice Stick noodles in hot water for 30 minutes. Then drain.
5. Serve with Seattle Fish Works's Peanut Sauce and Bean Sprouts, Carrots and Purple Cabbage.
