Try turmeric-scented chicken tagine at Toubkal (48 Place Djemaa el Fna). Hit the souks for leather slippers in a palette of colours from La Perle Fassi (5 Souk Semmarine). Sample an almond smoothie at Laitière Al Jaouda (Routes Dabachi and Kennair Dbchi) before a scrub and steam at Hammam Ziani (14 Rue Riad Zitoune Jdid) and a traditional dinner at Le Marrakchi (52 Rue des Banques).
